A Documentary by Bren Ortega Murphy and Mike Whalen

Although most Roman Catholic women religious [nuns and sisters] in the U.S. have not worn the full habits of their orders for over 40 years, images of nuns and sisters in such habits can be found in numerous and surprising aspects of pop culture. They are proliferating both in number and kind. This documentary examines the wide variety of visual images of Catholic nuns and sisters used in contemporary U.S. popular culture, and contrasts these images with the lives of actual women religious, both historical and current. Over 30 women religious, cultural critics, historians and artists have been interviewed including: Sr. Helen Prejean (Dead Man Walking), Tom Fontana (Oz, Homicide), Robert Orsi (Madonna of 115th Street). The film looks at the nature, scope and significance of these images as well as possible explanations for their increasing popularity and possible impact on our understanding of women religious.
